SAB Board Meeting

7:00pm meeting called to order and began with prayer and pledge of allegiance

Minutes from September 8, 2021 were approved

Meg proposed special intentions for Fr. Tom's father who is hospitalized for the 2nd time with COVID.

Approximately 10-15 parents attended the meeting. Some in favor of the mask mandate and a majority of parents against the mask mandate.

Parent speakers were limited to 5 minutes and SAB did not respond to any direct questions or concerns. Speakers included:

Tami Sova- Pharmacist who is passionate about removing the mask mandate. She gave some COVID statistics from other schools and districts. "How do we address wearing masks in school but nowhere else?" She feels masks are negatively impacting learning ability.

Jayne Balch- Against masks and wanted to know what experts Administration are consulting.

Amy Cook- Does not think the mask mandate makes sense. "Where are we going with all of this?" Noted that many of her close friends have left St. Pats.

Courtney Eden- Neutral on masks. Noted that Administration has good intentions and supports their decisions, regardless.

Sarah McIntyre – "This tearing apart our community." St. Patrick's job is to educate her kids not want medical intervention. She has a pediatrician for medical advice. Sarah also sent a few emails over the past 30 days. "How much is it worth it to you?"

Ty Christensen- Spoke directly to Fr. Tom. "How many families have left?" Noted he ran for SAB and was not elected. If he is elected in the future, his goal will be to remove the Advisory piece of School Board. He mentioned the SAB member have a "fluffy title". "Stop the nonsense?"

Melissa Cupich- Expressed gratitude to administration as it relates to the stress and time they have endured over the past 2 years.

Brian Krejci- Told Father to take the pressure off of himself. Stay positive. We are blessed to have Father at St. Patrick's

STARS Assessment:

Reading: 7th and 8th grade scores for reading level shows a drop in grading. Assumptions were made that it relates more middle school kids picking up devices instead of books.



Math: St Patrick's scores are above the Archdioceses of Omaha in all grade levels. 8th grade has seen solid improvement, year of year. This is largely credited to Mrs. Hoiem.

Pastor's Remarks:

- 90% of priests prefer not to go to a parish without a school due to additional work. Fr. Tom embraces it.
